Good Neighbourhood Group Report April 2020: Trinity Ellesmere Port

In light of the COVID 19 lockdown life at Trinity, like everywhere, has undergone a seismic shift in recent weeks but thankfully is still very much a functioning operation to the community through the activity of Port Grocery and West Cheshire Foodbank.

Port Grocery operate each day from Monday to Friday delivering to customers and those in need. They also now provide three pop up sessions across the Wirral including Eastham and Bromborough. They currently are delivering around 170 food parcels each day and are helping around 70+ vulnerable people each week (although this number is growing all the time as people contact the organisation. I have passed many emails that have been sent via our website. The deliveries are supported by volunteers from the community who while being placed on furlough have generously agreed to be involved.

West Cheshire Foodbank now operate from Trinity as the central point of operation in Ellesmere Port and run sessions each day (except Wednesday). They are approximately serving around 40 to 50 people each week, many of whom have families, so the positive input is even greater.









Rev. Jackie Bellfield, along with some volunteers have worked hard to create a memorial garden placing pieces of wool on the trellis to represent each person that has died due to the Covid19 pandemic in this country. A powerful reminder of this potent virus which has devastated families across the globe.
